







COHAS PUMP STATION IMPROVEMENTS



The Cohas Avenue pump station project for the Manchester NH Water Works is winding down. One of the most challenging aspects to this project was the need for a complete electrical and controls change over with little or no system down time. Working closely with the general contractor, Penta Corp., and the Manchester Water Works crew, headed by Roger Gagnon, we were able to successfully accomplish this.

As this project involved a good portion of highvoltage work, which is outside our wheelhouse, it required partnering with a competent subcon-

tractor. Many thanks to Daniel Burke and his team at EC&I, Inc. for their support. After a few long days we were able to completely remove the old

substation and install new power transmission lines and transformers to the station safely and efficiently.

With a combined effort from Neil Davis' and Craig Sharpe's crews, this project is nearing completion on schedule. Great job everyone!


The final, and most challenging, phase of our makeover will involve floor repairs and complete replacement of all carpeting. We are excited for project completion!



FEATURED PROJECT Home Farm Water Treatment Plant Shrewsbury, MA

Electrical Installations, Inc. was given the subcontract to provide the instrumentation and controls for the new Home Farm Water Treatment Plant in Shrewsbury, MA, which included construction of a new building to replace the old water plant. The new plant was recently put online. To date, we have supplied all of the instrumentation and provided a PLC control panel to tie-in the plant to the new filter PLC Panel and the existing remote pump stations and water tank PLCs. We also provided a redundant SCADA system which has two SCADA nodes acting in a redundant pair as well as two remote view nodes.

This plant was designed to remove Manganese that is present in all the wells in the Town of Shrewsbury. This plant is the first in Massachusetts to use a new technology, Mangazur, which has filter media that contains microscopic organisms that consume manganese. This technology does not require the filter to be regenerated due to continuous growth of microbes within the filter. This fascinating technology also does not require chemical addition for preoxidation, minimizing the amount of chemical required for the plant. Filter backwashing efficiency is also a major benefit of this technology as they can get up to 96 hours of operation instead of 8 with other types of filters. This plant is the largest Mangazur plant in the northeast.

This state-of-the-art project was completed on time and under budget by EI's Westport staff: Mike Leary, Project Manager, assisted by Jared Leary and supported by Kim Souza and Mitchell Leary. Congratulations to all on a job well done!



Training continued with instruction by Ready Equipment, LLC on proper operation of El's Genie Scissor Lift and related safety precautions. This training was in compliance with OSHA standards and all trainees received a Certificate of Successful Completion of Aerial & Scissor Lift Operation. With additional training, Matt Blood also completed Aerial Lift/Scissor Lift Trainer's Certification enabling him to conduct future training sessions.

We are pleased to report that thirteen individuals successfully completed both training sessions and are now fully qualified in these important areas.
