Charlie's Quality Corner

Fiber Optic Topics

We are using fiber optics for networking and control to an unprecedented level now, and the future will see an even greater migration to, and reliance on, this technology.

I want to stress the dangers of a cavalier attitude when using the hardware. The fiber strands are very fragile, and the connector ends are easily damaged. It is critical to keep the dust covers on the jumpers and bulkheads when not in use. Recently our OTDR tester had difficulties, and we found many micro fractures in the connector faces only visible with a high-power microscope. Apparently, this happens frequently if the cable is handled roughly or if the protective end caps are not in place. Dust and fine dirt are the enemies of fiber optic communication.

FEATURED PROJECT

CONTROL PANEL AND INSTRUMENTATION FOR ROTARY SCREW PRESS MIDDLEBOROUGH, MA WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT

For this project, Electrical Installations, Inc. is supplying rotary screw press controls to the equipment manufacturer, FKC Co., Ltd. of Port Angeles, WA. We are supplying a complex control panel that will control two presses and ancillary equipment. We have built and programmed similar control panels in the past for Merrimack and Berlin, NH.

The rotary screw press is taking the place of belt filter presses in many treatment plants. The press is more efficient in removal of water from sludge and uses significantly less energy. The controls we are supplying are state-of-the-art redundant, hot backup, programmable





controllers. The control panel,

including instrumentation, is valued at nearly \$130,000.00. Many thanks to Matt Blood, Casey Damon, Brian Chevrette, and Darlene Chevrette for their good work on this and other similar systems.

Under a sizable subcontract from long-time customer, Methuen Construction, El is also providing instrumentation for the overall upgrade at the Middleborough Wastewater Treatment Plant. Stay tuned for more updates from Mike Leary who is

Charlie's Quality Corner Connections

99.99% of all power, control and instrumentation problems can be traced back to loose or improper connections. We sometimes see critical processes interrupted by poorly made connections. Some considerations are:

- The preferred method for terminating power cables is to use compression connectors. Always use a crimper listed for use with the connector and apply the properly rated cable to connector. Check the temperature rise of the connector to match or exceed the rating of the equipment.
- Be sure to strip enough insulation off control and instrumentation cable. Torque terminal strips to manufacturer's specifications.
- Avoid "bird caging" when terminating finely stranded control wires.
- Be sure to insulate splices and connections with listed insulating materials which meet or exceed the conductor insulation and temperature ratings.
- Allow for insulating over sharp edges and for vibration.

Wastewater Treatment Facility Aeration System Upgrade Manchester, NH



Previously, the Manchester Wastewater Treatment Facility treated up to 30 million gallons of wastewater per day serving Manchester, Bedford, and other surrounding towns. The upgrade project increased treatment to up to 60 million gallons per day! Since 1990, Electrical Installations, Inc. has designed



and installed upgrades to this facility's influent pumping, clarifiers and thickeners, chemical treatment, and now the aeration system. As part of this project, we modernized and upgraded the complete SCADA system and installed new state-of-the-art controls throughout the facility. PIERCE ISLAND WASTEWATER TREATMENT PLANT UPGRADE



After many years of planning, design and an extensive public process, the largest capital improvement project in the history of the City of Portsmouth, the *Pierce Island WWTP Upgrade*, is underway! This four-year project, which could reach \$100M by completion, was awarded to Methuen Construction in late August, and EII is excited to undertake the system integration and Instrumentation / Process Control portion of this project.

The upgrade, required by a legal

order from the Environmental Protection Agency (EPA), will expand the treatment of wastewater to include a secondary process which will remove organics and nitrogen from the effluent discharged into the Piscataqua River / Atlantic Ocean. We are providing a best available control technology, proven control system. The system is incorporating many 21st century innovations and should be the most advanced in the Northeast.

In an effort to keep residents, businesses and visitors informed as to project status and impact, the City has created a website devoted to providing news and updates regarding construction schedules, traffic and other information, including the accessibility of recreational areas, such as the State Fish Pier, Public Boat Launch (seasonal), Four Tree Island Parking Lot, Off-Leash Dog Area (currently closed) and PI Outdoor Pool (seasonal).
